Turdus migratorius



- Phylum: Chordata
- Lives throughout North America
- Eats beetle grubs, caterpillars, and grasshoppers, and 60 percent wild and cultivated fruits and berries
- Runs across the grass and picks up earthworms it sees
- Has wings
- Can fly

Minnow

Part of the Family: Cyprinidae



- Phylum: Chordata
- Lives in the water
- Originates from North America, Africa, and Eurasia.
- Lives in rivers and streams
- Hunted recreational
- Has scales and backbone
- Eat aquatic and terrestrial insects, mayfly, caddisfly larvae, and amphipods.

Nematode



- Phylum: Nematoda
- Lives in water and dirt
- "Nematodes have successfully adapted to nearly every niche from marine to fresh water, from the polar regions to the tropics, as well as the highest to the lowest of elevations."
- Feed on algae, fungi, small animals, fecal matter, dead organisms and living tissues (vary based on species)

Water Strider (Gerridae)



• Phylum: Arthropoda

• Family: Gerridae

• They live on the surface of ponds, slow streams, marshes, and other quiet waters.

• Eat small insects that fall on the water's surface and larvae
